He loved being a South Ender, from his days growing up in a tiny house on Lear St to his high school years and beyond on Moler. He lived at the affectionately-dubbed "Gates Manor" just out of college, a house that was infamous for a lot of things that are not appropriate to print. And, the first home he owned was bought from his grandmother on Frebis Ave. His dad was a regular at the Sycamore back in its heyday and Stretch continued that tradition with Sunday Euchre until the bar closed.

One of his first jobs was at Papa Joe's but his claim-to-fame was as the first taste tester at the original Donatos Pizza, which made him a fan for life. He would have had Donatos for every meal if he could and he knew every Pickerington delivery guy by name, especially the one that found Ashley's cat under the garage door.

After moving away from the South End to raise his kids in the burbs, he never missed an opportunity to return to the neighborhood. His favorite bar was The Beck, just as much for special occasions as for the average happy hour. The annual visit from Woody Hayes at the Beck was enjoyed by everyone, including his grandsons. He loved stopping into Plank's Garten, Plank's Cafe, or a St Mary's festival to see family and friends. He spent most of the 80's and 90's at Greenlawn (now Berliner) and made some of his lifelong friends on the ball diamond and basketball court.

Stretch and Kathleen frequented the German Village yard sale and made it a point to stop in the Hey Hey every St Patrick's Day. Many Mother Mohawks and Bahama Mamas were enjoyed during his "business lunches" with coworkers, plumbers, his kids, Kathleen, or a combination of all of the above. He loved being with people and was at his best while holding court with a Budweiser in one hand and telling some outrageous story with the other. No one embodied one of his favorite Jack Ponstler quotes more than Stretch - "Don't confuse the issue with the facts".

He was a professional bullshitter. So much so that he was the self-proclaimed Best Shitter Salesman in Columbus for 35 years

He was loyal to a fault, a friend to many, and a jack-of-all-trades around the house. If he didn't know how to do it, he knew someone who did. The amount of water heaters he installed around Ohio would rival some of his longtime plumbing customers and he never asked for anything in return, which everyone understood meant a case of Bud.

Stretch was taken from us far too soon, but we are certain he was thankful to be aware during his final months so he could enjoy the continuous stream of visitors. For once, he had to sit back and listen to other people talk, which we all know was difficult for him. And true to his roots, his last drink was a Bud surrounded by the people that mean the most to him.
